## Meniscal Transplantation

**Verdonk Acta Orthop Belg 1998**

Fresh grafts, sutured without bone plugs

54 grafts in 51 patients, average age 36

FU 4.6 years

83% good results, 10% removed

Concomitant procedures:

Tibial Osteotomy 14

ACL recon 5




