Coronavirus risk assessment

It is vital that you take reasonable steps to prevent staff from being exposed to coronavirus. Our risk assessment identifies the hazards and appropriate control measures to follow. You will need to add specifics of your own practices, procedures and work activities.

Purpose

Our **Coronavirus Risk Assessment**, in our standard health and safety risk assessment template, identifies activities that may need to be completed during the pandemic. It identifies the *"Persons at risk"*, the *"Significant hazards"* and, most importantly, the *"Risk control measures"* that should be followed to reduce the risks to an acceptable level.

Detail

The first sections cover "Working during the coronavirus pandemic". Here our suggested control measures follow the government guidance closely. We have stated that "You must only travel to your workplace if your work absolutely cannot be done from home." and "If you leave your home, you should minimise any time spent outside and ensure that you are two metres apart from anyone outside your household."

Note. The government has made it clear that these rules must be followed. Those who fail to do so risk fines or even prosecution.

Welfare facilities

If staff and others are working on your premises, you must provide appropriate toilet, washroom and rest facilities. We have highlighted the need for all persons using such facilities to maintain good hygiene standards and if the two-metre rule cannot be followed the facility should not be used.

Maintaining standards

The document clarifies that your safe systems of work must be maintained. For example, staff are not to complete tasks they are not deemed competent in or use machinery in ways it is not designed for.

Additional requi	rements:	Staff must wear face coverings when in areas that are open to the public and where they are likely to come in close contact with others, unless they have an exemption. If they have a face mask exemption, a visor must be worn.									

Note. PPE must only be considered when other control measures, such as guarding, local exhaust extraction, preventing noise at source, eliminating the need to work at height etc. are not possible. PPE should always be considered as a last resort option. PPE should only be worn when there is reasonable justification for doing so.

Following rescribed afe ystems of vork	 Under no circumstances are staff or contractors to be asked to complete tasks that they're not deemed competent in/authorsed to perform. There are to be no exceptions to this rule. Prescribed safe systems of work must be followed at all times. If necessary, the safe system of work must be formally amended before adopting new work practices. New safe systems must not increase risks to those completing the job, or anyone else who may be affected. Due to staff absence there may be times when direct supervision levels are less than normal. Staff are expected to maintain normal working practices. Anyone failing to do so will be subject to disciplinary procedures. If a pre-start check identifies any safety-critical faults, or a fault is identified during use, normal rules apply. The equipment must be taken out of use and corrective action taken. It must not be used if it is deemed to be unsafe. If training that has a fixed expiry date runs out, site management will speak to the training provider to seek guidance. In many instances, grace periods are being extended to reflect the lack of available courses. 	1 5	5
