Summary

This discussion explored three cases involving complex decision-making and red flags. One involved a woman presenting with LBP who also had signs of potential stroke. A second case involved MRI evidence of possible cauda equina syndrome and the third addressed an unsolicited email from a patient's partner, leading to ethical concerns around confidentiality and documentation. Across all cases, the importance of clinical judgement, safeguarding, consent, and professional candour was reinforced. Practitioners were encouraged to act decisively, communicate clearly, document appropriately, and reflect on their responses.
