Summary

The discussion focused on the role and limitations of knee imaging in clinical practice. It highlighted the unreliability of clinical tests and emphasised the need for high-quality imaging to make accurate diagnoses. Various imaging modalities - X-ray, ultrasound, CT, MRI, and bone SPECT - were reviewed for their strengths and appropriate uses. The conversation included a critique of NICE guidelines, arguing that they reflect cost-saving measures rather than best practice. The danger of misleading MRI reports, poor-quality scans, and over-reliance on imaging alone was emphasised. The discussion concluded with a strong recommendation for contextual clinical judgement, a low threshold for imaging, and an emphasis on clinician responsibility for accurate interpretation.
