
CPD EVENT RECORD THE LANGUAGE OF TOUCH

Summary

This discussion concerned the value of touch as a therapeutic intervention. Evidence was drawn from primate studies and elsewhere, showing how the overall effect is greater than simply placebo. Where trigger points are concerned, an introduction to pain patterns was made, with explanation of how physical therapy can be used to overcome dysfunction.
