Summary

This discussion with the General Osteopathic Council covered issues surrounding Fitness to Practise, CPD, Regulation and the future of the osteopathic profession.

In particular, the need for registrants to be very aware of communication and consent issues, in order to minimise the likelihood of complaints, was addressed. The complaints process was explained and the speakers gave their reasons for the often lengthy delays in reaching a conclusion. The possibility of the GOsC being subsumed or combined with another regulator was raised, but there was no current information available.
