Recording: Learning by Oneself

Evaluation, Reflection and Impact on Practice

Summary

This CPD consisted of the presentation of a number of cases which the speakers had found challenging and/or informative. In one, the practitioner had been the first to learn of a diagnosis of terminal cancer in a patient, and described the emotional stress which arose, particularly when communicating the diagnosis to the patient. Another case involved the impact that psychological stress had played in maintaining a patient's pain; dealing with that aspect dramatically resolved the problem. Also discussed were a number of cases of aortic aneurysm and their presenting features, deep vein thrombosis, abdominal mass, sudden disc prolapse and the unexpected side-effect of an otherwise successful dry-needling treatment.

Reflection

I undertook this training because I felt it would be instructive to learn from other practitioners' clinical experience. The cases discussed were very useful in helping me prepare for difficult situations and gave me information to help improve my own diagnostic skills. My patients will benefit fro this, and I wil be able toffer better overall care.
