Evaluation, Reflection and Impact on Practice

Summary

This discussion focussed on 3 cases where important findings had been overlooked by one or more radiologist or consultant. The message was that it is important to be able to recognise the key elements in MRI imagery and not be afraid to question reports. In one set of images osteophytic change in two vertebrae was the likely cause of symptoms but had been missed. The appearance of the abnormality was explained as well as the possibility that other, more obvious imperfections were asymptomatic. The third set of images were actually of the lumbar spine and showed an osteoid osteoma. Although difficult to spot, the key aspects were explained and the significance made clear.
