Summary

This discussion set about linking chaos theory with manual therapy, explaining how the concept of "strange attractors" could relate to the myofasia and to trigger points. The pain maps associated with trigger points were related to a 3D animation, which showed how they might have arisen as a result of quadripedal gait, deep in our evolutionary past.
